### Making Headlines ...

#### India ranks second in medical tourism

Healthcare researchers at Deloitte Inc based on a two year study have revealed that India ranks second in medical tourism. In 2007, Indian hospitals treated 450,000 foreign patients. Thailand topped the list in 2007.

#### India emerges as third largest market in low-carbon and green goods & services

A British government report indicates that India has a market value of £191 billion in low-carbon and environmental goods & services (LCEGS). With a 6% share of the £3,046-billion global market, India is tied with Japan at the third position. The US leads with a market share of 20.6% followed by China with 13.5% market share.

#### Reliance Begins Natural gas Production in Krishna-Godavari basin

Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) has commenced natural gas production from its D-6 block in the Krishna-Godavari (KG) basin. The development is expected to reduce import bill by US\$ 9 billion annually. With the peak production of 80 million standard cubic metre a day (mscmd), the D6 Block in KG Basin, will nearly double the country's domestic gas production and constitute about 44 per cent of current oil and gas production. The D6 gas is estimated to contribute about a sixth (1/6th) of the total India's domestic petroleum and gas consumption.

#### India top receiver of foreign remittances

According to World Bank data, an estimated 5.7 million Indian workers abroad sent to India US \$27 billion in 2007 to make India the top receiver of migrant remittances. China, Mexico, Philippines and France are the other top five receivers of foreign remittances

#### Airbus plans manufacturing base in India

European aircraft manufacturer Airbus Industry plans to have a manufacturing base in India in the next three-four years following a strong presence in areas such as engineering, research, design and training. The airplane maker said that it is bullish on the emerging market like India and see a double-digit growth in the region in the long-run. Airbus currently employs 200 highly-skilled at its design centre in Bangalore, and proposes to double to 400 in the next few years, said Christian Scherer Airbus executive vice president.

As manufacturers look at reducing costs and product development cycles, India is fast emerging as the new-age design board for MNCs.

### 26-Member Indian Pharma Business Delegation Visits Kuala Lumpur

Pharmaceuticals Export Promotion Council (PHARMEXCIL) together with the High Commission organized a Buyer-Seller Meet (BSM) was on 30 March 2009 at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel, Kuala Lumpur. A 26-member Indian business delegation led by Mr. Devendra Chaudhry, Joint Secretary, Department of Pharmaceuticals, Government of India, attended the BSM. Senior Representatives from the Ministry of Health, KLSICCI, and the Associated Chinese Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ACCIM) were present at the inaugural function. The BSM provided a good



platform to the Indian delegation to establish initial tie-ups as well as to appoint local representatives for their products. It evoked good response with 70 business meetings held during the day. The product range covered included bulk drugs and its intermediates, formulations, herbal and ayurvedic medicines, biotech and biological products, diagnostics, surgicals, nutraceuticals, and pharma industry related services.

### Malaysia-India Business Council (MIBC) CEO Forum

Malaysia-India Business Council (MIBC) CEO Forum held its inaugural annual general body meeting on 30 March 2009. Dato' Krishnan Tan, CEO, IJM Sdn. Bhd was elected President of the MIBC. MIBC also signed an MOU with Federation of Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) to strengthen institutional cooperation between the two bodies in promoting India-Malaysia economic and commercial engagement. The MOU was witnessed by High Commissioner of India Mr. Ashok K. Kantha and Datuk Dr. Rebecca Fatima Sta Maria, Deputy Secretary General (Trade), Ministry of International Trade and Industry of the Government of Malaysia.

### West Bengal Delegation Visits Kuala Lumpur

Dr. Sabyasachi Sen, Principle Secretary (Industry and Trade) from the State of West Bengal (India) and Mr. Indranil Das Gupta, CEO of Bengal Integrated Auto Industry Park Ltd (BIAIP) paid a three-day visit to Malaysia from 30 March 2009 to explore potential Malaysian investors in West Bengal particularly in BIAIP. The West Bengal delegation met senior officials in the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI), Malaysian Industrial Development Authority (MIDA), MATRADE as well as senior executives of Malaysian automakers and other companies having business operations in India.

### MAS Aerospace Engineering (MAE) to setup MRO in Hyderabad

MAS Aerospace Engineering (MAE), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Malaysian Airlines, and GMR Hyderabad International Airport (GHIAL) have signed an agreement to set up a 50:50 joint venture namely MAS-GMR Aerospace Engineering Company Ltd. to undertake airframe Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) in Hyderabad. The state-of-the art JV is expected to be operational by 2010, with a capacity to service annually 60 to 80 aircraft of both narrow and wide bodied ones.

### ITEC Day and International Students Day Observed

Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Day and the International Students Day were observed at India House at a function organized on 23 March 2009 by the High Commission. Among those in attendance included academicians, think-tanks, prominent Malaysians who had studied in India, and Malaysian Government officials who had participated in capacity building training programmes in India. The High Commissioner of India Mr. Ashok K. Kantha addressed the gathering which was followed by an exchange of views. Forty (40) Malaysian professionals attended training programmes in India in the FY 2008-09.

## Spotlight continues: INDIA—A DESIGN AND ENGINEERING HUB

The expertise of Indian designers in 3D-modelling and plant engineering in sectors like aerospace, automotive and industrial design has already caught the attention of leading companies from both Europe and America.

The result: MNCs like Whirlpool, GE, LG, Philips, Bosch, Dell Computer, Ford Motor, Toyota Corp., Ferrari, Honda Motor, Rambus Inc. and Wind River Systems Inc are setting up India centres, others like Reckitt, Boeing and Airbus are offshoring design work to Indian design houses.

### AUTOMOBILE DESIGN

Indian automobile companies have come of age and can today boast of several indigenously designed cars.

- ◇ Tata Motors has designed and developed its small cars Nano and Indica in India.
- ◇ Maruti Udyog engineers after working on designing Swift, SX4, Zen Estilo and Concept A-Star, are likely to design Swift Sedan, Splash and Kizashi.
- ◇ Bangalore's Harita Infoserve Ltd is developing interior parts and conducting computer tests on components for General Motors Corp.
- ◇ Plexion Technologies has worked on the interior design and windows for a Daimler Chrysler bus.
- ◇ Mahindra & Mahindra have successfully designed and built its car, Scorpio as also multi-utility farm vehicle, 'Shaan', which has captured 6 per cent share in US market.



TATA NANO

India has now established itself as a 'brand in engineering' with global original equipment manufacturers (OEMs), looking at India as a good outsourcing hub.

- ◇ General Motors, Hyundai, Toyota, Ford Motor, Ferrari, and Honda Motor are all boosting Indian outsourcing, as are key component makers such as Robert Bosch, TRW Automotive, Visteon and Collins & Aikman.
- ◇ By 2010, the Indian automotive design and engineering services industry is likely to cross US\$ 1 billion (from US\$ 270 million–US\$ 300 million in 2005); and the employee strength of India-based automotive design vendors will reach 40,000 (from about 12,000 in 2005).

The increasing use of high-end software in automobile design and R&D has made Indian auto majors leverage the country's software prowess and gain an edge over their European and American competitors.

- ◇ By June 2009, the US\$ 6 billion Mahindra & Mahindra group will open its new US\$ 116 million automobile design and development facility;
- ◇ Tata Motors has six R&D centres that span India, South Korea, Spain and the UK. In 2006, it acquired INCAT. Recently, Tata Motors bought a stake in Italian car design firm, Pininfarina, which has designed some landmark Ferraris.
- ◇ Suzuki is planning to outsource its high-end model development to India for the next-gen small cars.
- ◇ Hyundai is also focussing on R&D in India. It has set up a US\$ 40 million computer-aided design centre in Hyderabad.
- ◇ General Motors (GM) has set up a US\$ 60 million technical centre, including a design centre, engineering services and and R & D facility, in Bangalore for developing new technologies and shaping new cars.

With global car makers eyeing low-cost countries for expansion, and styling and looks gaining in importance among consumers, the demand for auto designers in the country is increasing. Experts say as many as 10,000 automotive designers would be required in India in the next seven years. Taking a cue, some institutions such as National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad; Maharashtra Institute of Technology (MIT), Pune; Industrial Design Centre (IDC) at IIT-Mumbai ; IIT-Guwahati ; IIT-Madras ; DJ Academy of Design, Coimbatore and Raffles Design International (RDI), Mumbai have all entered the sector.



### Semiconductor design

Indian semiconductor design industry comprises of VLSI design, board design and embedded software companies. India has almost 130 chip design companies, with almost all global design semiconductor companies setting up design operations in India.

According to report by India Semiconductor Association (ISA) and IDC India, Indian semiconductor design services industry is likely to grow at an annual growth rate of about 21.7 per cent between 2007–2010. The design market in India for 2007 was estimated at US\$ 6 billion, with 81 per cent of the revenue coming from embedded software. The market is expected to grow to \$ 10.96 billion in 2010.



The domestic semiconductor and embedded design services industry is all set to enter a new phase - Ver 2.0, following on from Ver 1.0. India's hardware design capabilities have received a major boost with the launch of Intel's next generation microprocessors which were completely designed by the Intel India development team. The Intel Xeon 7400 series processor is Intel's first six-core central processing unit (CPU).

Bangalore leads with around 85 design firms with over 30 captive offshore design centres, making it one of the top global clusters in chip design, comparable to Silicon Valley, Cambridge (in the UK) and Taiwan.

A study by Synopsys Inc. in 2007 revealed that India has overtaken Europe as the hotbed of wireless IC design with about 38 per cent of Indian designers working on designs targeting wireless and mobile applications as compared with just about 22 per cent in Europe.

### Engineering Services

India has a robust and diversified manufacturing base for a varied range of basic and capital goods to meet the requirements of sectors like heavy electrical, process equipment, automobiles, power generation and transmission, shipping, aviation, mining, chemicals & petroleum.



Oil Rigs

The Engineering Services Outsourcing (ESO) sector has great potential, including in product design, research and development and other technical services across sectors like automotive, aerospace, hi-tech/telecom, utilities and construction/industrial machinery. According to a study by NASSCOM and Booz Allen Hamilton (a strategy and technology consulting firm), the global engineering services market is estimated to touch US\$ 1,100 billion by 2020 of which, the outsourced component is estimated to reach around US\$ 200 billion in the same span of time. Presently, the ESO market is worth around US\$ 15 billion with India's share of 12 per cent.

### Government Initiatives

The Designs Act 2000 has put in place a framework for documentation, classification, representation, registration, acceptance, inspection, cancellation, certification and legal redressal. The Union Cabinet has also approved the National Design Policy in 2007 with the aim to globally position and brand Indian designs and making 'designed in India' a by-word for quality and utility. The policy also envisages:

- ◇ Setting up of specialised Design Centres of 'Innovation Hubs'.
- ◇ Enhancing the status of the National Institute of Design (NID) as a global centre of excellence and setting up two-three undergraduate design centres.
- ◇ Launching the Good Design Mark to promote domestic designs.
- ◇ Setting up of new institutes and sector-specific design education centres.
